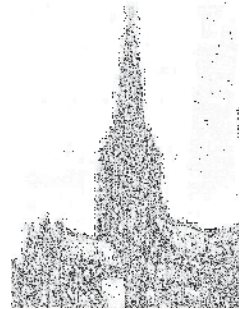

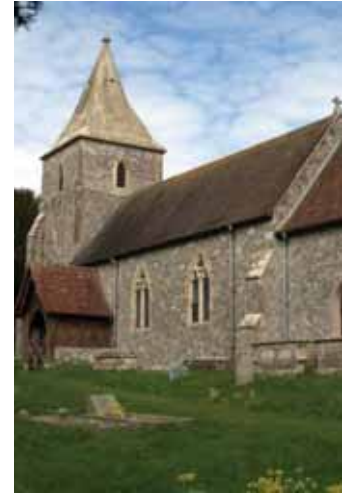

And give to others as from you.

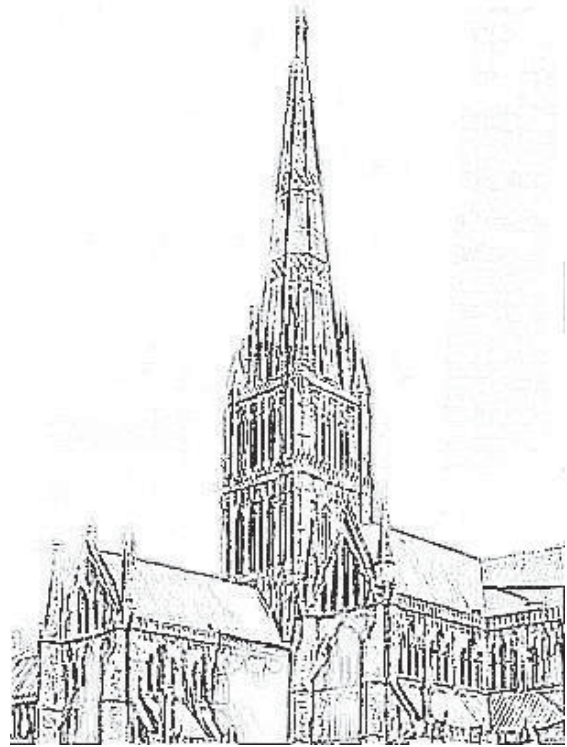
