MONTHLY PRAYER DIARY FOR DECEMBER 2025

Monday 1st – Saturday 6th

- Mon.1st** Lord God, we pray for the **life of our church and all who contribute to our common life together.** We give special thanks for Suzanne our Vicar, Martin our Assistant Priest and our Ministry Team, Hilary G, Graham, John and Jenny, and for the varied and imaginative liturgy we enjoy in our worship each Sunday.
- Tue.2nd** On **National Grief Awareness week**, we pray that you would comfort those who are struggling with loss. We ask that you would bring them peace. Help us to weep with those who weep, and point them towards your unconditional love. 'The Lord is close to the broken-hearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.' (Psalm 34:18)

- Sat.6th** On **St Nicholas Day**, we remember your servant Nicholas whose legacy is one of generosity. Lord, help us to give freely, just as we have freely received, and help us to be mindful of those in need that we might love others as you have loved us.

Sunday 7th – Saturday 13th

- Sun.7th** We pray for our **churches across the Salisbury Diocese** as they hold events and services during Advent. Lord, may your church be a place of support and hope this Christmas. We also pray that those who attend a church service or event for the first time this Christmas would feel welcome, and they would know your love and peace.
- Mon.8th** Those **living in** Lonnen Road, Little Lonnen, Lonnen Wood Close, Wood View, Rotary Close, Four Wells Road, Sandy Lane & Sandy Close.

- Tue.9th** Heavenley Father, we lift up **persecuted Christians** to you. Grant them strength, courage and unwavering faith. Surround them with your protection and love and bless their steadfast witness in the midst of unimaginable pain and suffering.
- Wed.10th** On **International Human Rights Day**, we pray for all those around the world whose human rights are ignored or violated. Help us build a society built on the knowledge that every person is made in God's image.
- Thu.11th** We pray **for those who are preparing to lead us in worship on Sunday**, including our choir and organist. Holy Spirit, guide and inspire them, that through our worship, those present may be brought closer to you.
- Fri.12th** Lord, we ask for your blessing on our **Church School, St. Michael's Middle**. for Darren Ayling, its Headteacher, children, staff and Academy Committee.
- Sat.13th** Father, we give thanks for our **Lay Pastoral Assistants**, Barbara, Liz and Richard in their ministry of care.

Sunday 14th - Saturday 20th

- Sun.14th** Reflecting on the words of Isaiah 9:6, we pray: Lord, as **Christmas approaches**, we remember the birth of your Son Jesus, whom you sent to us to be the Saviour of the world. We pray that throughout the busyness of the season, you would help us to fix our eyes and hearts on you, our Wonderful Counsellor, our Might God, our Everlasting Father, our Prince of Peace. Amen
- Mon.15th** As **schools break up for the Christmas holidays**, we pray for pupils and staff, that this break would be a time of rest and restoration. We give thanks for churches across the Salisbury Diocese that will be offering worship and activities over Christmas and pray that children and young people attending would know more of who you are.
- Tue.16th** Pray for **something or someone** that may be on your mind at the present time.
- Wed.17th** Isaiah prophesied the coming of the child Jesus and that **'his authority shall grow continually and there shall be endless peace'**. **God of all peace**, speak your peace to our restless souls, bring your peace to our troubled lives and, establish your peace in our broken world. We bring before you especially the situation in Gaza, Lebanon, Ukraine and Sudan and South Sudan.

Thu.18th We pray for **those who are preparing to lead us in worship over the busy Christmas period**, including our choir and organist. Holy Spirit, guide and inspire them, that through our worship, those present may be brought closer to you.

Fri.19th We pray for **Cherubs**, our mums and carers toddlers' group and for all who contribute to its management and activity.

Sat.20th Caring Father, we give thanks for **Wimborne Food Bank** and especially for its volunteers who give so much of their time. We pray for parents who will struggle to feed their families during this Christmas season.

Sunday 21st - Wednesday 31st

Sun.21st We pray for the work of **our Diocese of Salisbury**, remembering especially our Bishops Stephen, Karen and Andrew. Lord, bless them in their ministry. Guide them in their teaching and in the decisions, they have to make. Come Holy Spirit, grant unto them energy and vision in the responsibilities they undertake.

Mon.22nd We pray for those who find **Christmas a difficult time of year**, and for those who are alone at Christmas. We pray that they would know that they are not alone, that you are with them, and they are unconditionally loved. Bring them comfort during this time.

Thu.25th On **Christmas Day**, we celebrate the birth of our Saviour, Jesus Christ who has rescued and redeemed us. O Come let us adore him, for he alone is worthy! We give thanks for our loved ones, and we pray for rest and reconciliation, comfort and joy.

- Fri.26th** On **Saint Stephen's Day** we remember the first martyr, who before his death gazed steadfastly into heaven and saw the glory of God, and who prayed for the forgiveness of those who killed him (Acts 7:54-59). Lord, please strengthen us in our suffering and pain, teach us to love our enemies, and help us to faithfully bear witness to your name.
- Sat.27th** On the **Feast Day of St John the Evangelist**, we give thanks for his Gospel, written so that we may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, and by believing have life in his name (John 20:31). We pray that through his writings we would deeply know this truth and share it with others, that they may believe as well.
- Sun.28th** On this **Holy Innocents Day**, we pray for children throughout the world who are the innocent victims of trauma as a result of war, neglect, abuse and cruelty. We give thanks for organisations who support and care for children remembering in our country the work of the **Children's Society**.
- Mon.29th** God of compassion, we pray for **the homeless and all those who sleep outdoors** at night, especially during this Christmas season. We give thanks for those who devote their lives to supporting homeless people and who share the vision of a society without homelessness. We pray for the work of **Crisis, the Salvation Army, Routes to Roots in Poole and other Charities committed to this cause**.
- Tue.30th** Pray for a cause **dear to your heart** not mentioned elsewhere.
- Wed.31st** On **New Year's Eve**, we remember all that has taken place this year. Amidst the trials and difficulties, we give thanks for every blessing, knowing that God works all things for the good of those who love him. **May we enter the New Year with our eyes fixed on Jesus**.
